## **Definitions**

Foreign National – any person not a U.S. citizen, including:

- Nonimmigrant visitors (e.g. students, tourists, etc.)
- •Lawful permanent residents
- •Illegal aliens

<u>Consular Officer</u> – citizen of a foreign country employed by a foreign government to provide assistance on behalf of that government to that government's citizens in a foreign country



- 1. Notify foreign consulate or embassy within 24-72 hours.
- 2. By fax, email or telephone.
- 3. Keep records of notification.



# When a foreign national is transferred in or out or your facility

- 1. Notify the foreign consul of their citizen's arrival or departure and where they are being transferred.
- 2. Keep records of notification.



# When a foreign national is seriously ill

- 1. Seriously ill unable to communicate on his/her own, i.e. in a coma, in intensive care
- 2. Notify the foreign consul of their citizen's arrival or departure and where they are being transferred.
- 3. Keep records of notification.



# When a foreign national dies in your facility

- 1. Notify the foreign consul of the death of their citizen.
- 2. Keep records of notification.



## Consular Access

#### **Types of Consular Access**

- Visits, phone calls, letters, etc.
- Depends on traditions, resources, and location of consulate

#### **Types of Consular Services**

- Arrange legal representation
- Monitor case progress
- Observe trials, court appearances
- Inquire about detention conditions
- Provide reading material, food, medicine
- Provide information to family members



# Consular Access

#### **Conditions for Access**

- Consuls generally must follow facility regulations regarding security, time, place, and manner of visits
- Consuls may not act as attorneys, or interfere with the criminal investigation or judicial process
- Treat at least as well as a defense attorney
- Treat as you would want a US Consul to be treated who is trying to visit an American citizen overseas



# Why?

#### **Legal Reasons**

 Under the U.S. Constitution, treaties are the Law of the Land

#### **Policy Reasons**

Reciprocity – Your actions directly affect Americans abroad


#### **Pragmatic Reasons**

- Prevent diplomatic complaints and State Department investigations
- Avoid litigation and legal challenges
- Consuls can help you!
